On June 29th, the Stafford Regional Choral Society put on a Family Fun day event at Colonial Forge High School, featuring free music and activities for the families of North Stafford. Festivities kicked off with face-painting, wand-making, and pictures with kids' favorite Disney characters (even Queen Elsa and Olaf made an appearance!) As a bonus for those already weather-weary, all events were held indoors, keeping kids cool and happy.



The show began with a surprise, when choral members arose from within the audience to sing Do You Feel the Rhythm?, ending up at the stage and ready to be led through the rest of the show by Princess Fiona and Snow White. The next number, You've Got a Friend In Me, was followed by two upbeat tunes in keeping with the Cowboy theme, folk songs Cindy and Banjo Pickin' Girl. Next up, Dennis Alwine and Jenny Piner slowed things down a bit with a superb duet of Somewhere Out There.



The next piece was both familiar and new, as SoundCHECK, the SRCS outreach ensemble, sang, scatted, and dittied a vocal arrangement of Linus and Lucy (the Peanuts theme); the only thing missing was Snoopy doing his

classic dance. SoundCHECK then transported the audience from classic America all the way across the sea to the Serengeti with Can You Feel the Love Tonight? The men then took the stage with a fun a cappella arrangement of The Lion Sleeps Tonight. Next, we were reminded by Kermit and soloist Alysha Jeans that it's not easy Bein' Green, but guest director Rachel Colby (and soloists Dennis Alwine and Don Spellmann) cheered us up with *Good Vibrations*. Keeping the good feelings going, the audience was asked to join in and sing along with Happy and soloists Pamela Abel, Kol Bergstrom, and Angela Ammerman, giving kids a chance to get some wiggles out.





The Scholarship Spotlight featured Andrew Liang, who was awarded the 2014 SRCS instrumental scholarship. Mr. Liang treated the audience to a performance of When Sunny Gets Blue, ushering in the intermission and a chance for little legs to stretch. An extra-long intermission allowed time for refreshments, more photos, crafts, and face painting-plus a chance to buy raffle tickets for the Disney Parks Pass Give-Away. Following a generous intermission, the audience was treated to familiar show tunes Seize the Day, by the stellar SRCS Men and My Favorite Things, by SoundCHECK. The littlest audience members were thrilled to see Olaf and Queen Elsa take the stage to sing a medley of songs from the movie Frozen, featuring soloists Dawn Abel, Kimberly Leone, Chris Moore, and Angela Ammerman.



The SRCS Scholarship Program is designed to enable talented high school seniors to continue their study of music during college regardless of their major course of study. SRCS is composed of lifelong musicians pursuing a variety of career paths; our scholarship awards allow students to work toward their dream and careers without sacrificing their love of music. Scholarships are awarded based on performance auditions scored by a panel of impartial judges. Applicants must submit complete application packets postmarked by the stated deadline and must audition on the stated date. Applications are provided to counselors and music teachers at all area high schools, and also available online at stafford choral.org.
