Our History

The Stafford Regional Choral Society is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization beginning its second decade of existence, drawing membership from Stafford, Spotsylvania, Prince William, and King George counties and the city of Fredericksburg. It has a three-fold mission: 1) to provide FREE culturally-enriching performances to the community; 2) to provide an opportunity for advancing musicianship and performance to singers and instrumentalists of varying skill levels in our communities; and 3) to encourage and enable young musicians to continue the study of music beyond high school through financial scholarship and merit awards.

Since 2001, the SRCS has presented over 45 concerts in Stafford County and Fredericksburg and we have entertained well over 10,000 patrons with our free concerts. Each year, under the direction of award-winning Artistic Director Barbara Perry, the SRCS presents the only production of the cherished holiday favorite, Handel’s *Messiah*, in Stafford County. This holiday feature is presented with orchestral accompaniment and soloists.

The SRCS provides a unique outlet for singers and musicians from the region to develop and showcase their musical talent. A key feature of the group’s composition is the inclusion of talented high school and college musicians in the chorus and orchestra. The dynamic relationship of more seasoned adult performers and highly talented younger musicians is a truly unique aspect that provides energy, and builds the musical skills of our performers.

The SRCS also has a long history of giving back to the community. While a main feature of the SRCS mission is to provide free concerts for the region, the Board of Directors has often felt compelled to step up the giving in a meaningful way. In 2001, the fledgling SRCS abandoned plans for a Broadway review in response to the tragic events of 9-11. As rehearsals began, plans were reworked to present an inspiring patriotic program that raised over

\$3,000 for 9-11 charities. In the spring of 2009, the SRCS presented an Autism Awareness Program and inspirational concert, *Songs for the Silent*. That benefit raised over \$6,000 for Reaching Potentials, a local autism therapy center. In 2010, SRCS and a large audience of wonderful supporters embraced the cause of wounded veterans by donating all contributions from the *Patriotic Celebration* to the Semper Fi Fund. The SFF is a non-profit organization that provides support and assistance to veterans from all branches of the military who were injured in support of Marine operations in Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom.

Since its inception, the SRCS has worked to nurture the future of the musical arts by providing scholarships to local college-bound musicians. Starting from a single award of \$500 in 2003, we now award a vocalist, a pianist, and an instrumentalist award of \$700 each and second place awards of \$350 each. Past recipients are now pursuing various career paths including music education and performing careers at institutions such as Virginia Commonwealth University, George Mason University, the Massachusetts Conservatory and Berklee School of Music, as well as having toured with national productions such as *Riverdance*.

Concerts and Fees

Typically, there are three concerts in the SRCS performance season: our Christmas concert, a gala fundraiser, and a summer concert. Singers are notified by email when the next concert cycle begins. Singers pay fees at the start of each cycle to cover the cost of the music, the accompanist, and the director. Fees are due at the beginning of the cycle unless prior arrangements have been made. Fees for singers are established by the SRCS Board of Directors for each concert session and are posted on the SRCS website, www.staffordchoral.org. Student fees are usually 50% of adult singer fees and apply for any active student. If you would like to sing with SRCS but are unable pay the posted fee please contact an SRCS Board of Directors member to discuss your situation.

What does a concert cost?

Our concerts generally cost \$4,000-\$6,000. Some of our expenditures include:

- Directors and instrumentalists
- Decorations and venue preparation
- Venue rental
- Lighting and sound
- Publicity flyers and postcards
- Newspaper and radio advertising
- Concert programs

Your concert fees provide funding toward our director and rehearsal accompanist fees. The remainder of concert costs need to be covered by donations, sponsorships, and fundraising.

Rehearsals

At the beginning of each concert cycle, you will be given a detailed sheet of rehearsal and concert times and locations. Most rehearsals are approximately two hours. You will be notified in advance of a change of location/time for rehearsals. Please allow at least 10 to 15 minutes before rehearsal starts to take care of any chorus business, socialize a little, and be in your seat ready to sing at the scheduled time. Rehearsals will begin promptly. Rehearsal and performance schedules are available on our website www.staffordchoral.org.

Rehearsal and Concert Supplies

Singers should bring a pencil to each rehearsal for marking their music, a water bottle, and a music folder or binder. The latter may be a simple black, 3-ring binder or an official SRSC music folder with the stretchy bands on the inside to hold your music.

Mark your Scores!

The Director will often make artistic changes in the music, so be ready with your pencil to mark your scores accordingly. Breath marks, dynamic markings, changes in text may be added or deleted, and you are expected to

have this information marked even if you miss a rehearsal. If you need assistance in marking your score, arrive early and ask someone in your section for assistance in marking missed information.

Rehearsal Breaks

Generally, we take a short break at some point during rehearsal. The break will be called by the Director. After the break, Chorus members are to move quickly to their seats, cease conversation, and get back to the business of making beautiful music. *SRCS* business is conducted and critical information provided after our break.

Use of Facility

We must make sure our rehearsal space is prepared for those who will use it next. The director will inform us as to what needs to be accomplished at the close of rehearsal. Please clean up water bottles. Concerts begin with set up and end with clean up. We all participate in these efforts.

Inclement Weather

Please check the *SRCS* website for the current information regarding inclement weather in regards to rehearsals and concerts. We have had to postpone concerts due to inclement weather. It is expected that members will consider their personal safety first in all inclement weather situations.

Attendance

Missed rehearsals impact everyone. Please do not assume that you will not be missed! Any more than three absences during a concert series can cause a hardship for both musician and the choir. If you anticipate missing specific rehearsals or experience an unexpected absence, please email that information to staffordregionalchoralsociety@yahoo.com. Dress rehearsal absences must be pre-approved by the director. Being present for last minute changes and artistic interpretations with the conductor and orchestra is a vital requirement for a cohesive performance.

Tardiness

Please be on time to rehearsal. Our directors will start on time and it is critical that all be prepared for warm up. Local music teachers use the quote, "To be early is to be on time, to be on time is to be late." Of course, the unexpected does happen and we would rather you be late than not attend.

What Should I Wear?

Attire for Concerts

The director will provide instruction on what singers will wear during a concert performance. Most commonly, "concert black" is worn. Concert Black means tuxedos for men and black formal wear (skirt to the floor or pants) for the women. SRCS members obtain and own their own concert black attire.

Use of Fragrance and Personal Hygiene

Chorus members are not to wear fragrances in the form of perfumes, strong hair spray, shaving cologne, etc. at any performance. Many people have allergies to fragrant products. However, it is important that SRCS members practice appropriate hygiene by bathing regularly and using deodorants.

Membership in the Society

Membership in the Society runs from October 1st to September 30th of the following year. Membership is open to any individual supporting the stated purpose of the Society and is current, relative to the dues and fees set by the Board of Directors. Dues and fees are established by the Board of Directors.

Board Membership

The SRCS Board of Directors is in charge of the general operation of the SRCS and assists with fundraisers, social activities and special events, venue setup, and membership. The Board of Directors is selected each year by vote of the membership. Currently, this occurs during the fall concert cycle. Attendance at Board of Director meetings is open to all SRCS member. We currently meet the second Tuesday of the month. If you are interested in Board membership, please consider attending our monthly Board meeting. Members attending have voice, but no vote. Location may change month to month and can be obtained from a board member. This is a great opportunity to see the inner workings of the SRCS and all it takes to do what we do!

SoundCheck

SoundCheck is the Choral Society's community outreach choir. Debuting in 2013, the audition only group seeks to extend the SRCS brand by contributing additional performances in local celebrations and events. The roughly 30-member group commits to rehearsal periods and performances for a specific season. If you are interested in auditioning for this group, please speak to the SoundCheck director for the next audition opportunity.

SRCS Scholarship Program

Since our inception we have worked to build an appreciation for and support of musical arts by providing annual scholarships to local college-bound musicians. The SRCS holds an annual scholarship competition. The scholarship is offered to musically talented high school seniors who reside in counties or cities from which the SRCS draws its membership and who will pursue music during college level. It is **not** required that the recipient plan to declare a music major. While any field of musical endeavor is acceptable, performance **is** a requirement for the scholarship audition. Our current program consists of three categories, vocal, piano, and instrumental. Most recently, scholarships of \$700 have been made available in each category and \$350 second place award in each category.

Application Deadline:

Applications must be complete and postmarked by the deadline date specified in the application instructions. Completed application includes letter of reference and promotional photograph. Incomplete packets will not be considered for audition.

Scholarship Audition:

Those receiving an audition will be notified regarding the time and location of audition. Auditions are generally held on a Saturday (date announced in application materials.) They begin in the morning at a time to be determined based on number of applicants.

Fundraisers

SRCS participates in fund raising activities each year. The events listed below are past fund raising activities in which SRCS was involved. The primary fund raising event is the silent auction during the spring Gala.

Community Give – For the past several years SRCS has participated in a local web-based donation day such as the Community Give program. This on-line giving event allows anyone in the community to give \$25 or more to SRCS and/or any of the local non-profit organizations registered for this one day event. Choir members, family and friends are encouraged to participate to raise funds for SRCS. SRCS receives the donation less a small processing fee and donors receive a tax deduction receipt.

Restaurant Fundraising – From time to time we have the opportunity to cooperate with a local restaurant to receive a portion of the receipts for a given period. We have had great success with area businesses. Look and listen for these opportunities to enjoy time out while supporting SRCS.

BINGO – This is another in our fundraising repertoire. We use the local American Legion Post 290 to host our BINGO fundraiser.

Gala Fundraiser – A hallmark event and highlight of the SRCS season is the annual Gala Benefit, which is our primary fundraiser for the year. This one-of-a-kind concert experience combines high-end cuisine, stellar vocals, and a professional combo in an elegantly intimate setting, transforming audience members into guests and friends interacting with the performance. The evening is enhanced by a Silent Auction and has also included raffle drawings and door prizes. The Gala is usually held in a ballroom facility on a spring Sunday evening. SRCS members support the fundraising effort through ticket sales, solicitation of Silent Auction donations, and/or volunteer time in decorating, set-up, or other duties as needed. Some examples of past Galas include *Jazz*, *Around the World*, *Hooray for Hollywood*, and, this year, *On Broadway*.
